

## BRITISH JOURNAL OF PREVENTIVE AND SOCIAL MEDICINE

The Journal is primarily concerned with the problems of public health and their solution. The field of interest includes studies of the distribution and behaviour of disease in human populations; the definition of the agents responsible for the patterns observed; the consideration of the modifying effect of social or environmental conditions on disease evolution; and the assessment of the health and efficiency of people exposed to various external circumstances. Linked with these subjects is the design of measures intended to control or prevent disease and the field assessment of their value in public health practice. Preventive and Social Medicine also encompasses the objective study of the organization and functioning of medical services with particular emphasis on the measurement of their efficiency.

### NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

#### COMMUNICATIONS.

Papers, which will be accepted on the understanding that they have not been and will not be published elsewhere and are subject to editorial revision, should be addressed to The Editors, *British Journal of Preventive and Social Medicine*, B.M.A. House, Tavistock Square, London, W.C.1.

The Editors cannot undertake correspondence about papers returned as unsuitable on the advice of members of the Editorial Board.

The author should make adequate reference to previous work on his subject, and provide a full summary of his observations and conclusions.

Articles must be typewritten on one side of the paper only in double spacing with ample margins.

#### ILLUSTRATIONS

These should be marked on the back with the author's name and the top edge indicated. Photographs should be printed on glossy paper, and should be a little larger than the size desired for reproduction. Graphs, charts, and tables should be presented on separate sheets apart from the text. Except letters and numbers, which should be lightly written in pencil, diagrams should be drawn in black ink on tracing linen, Bristol board, or smooth white paper.

#### REFERENCES

In the text, the year of publication must follow the author's name, more than one paper by the same author in any one year being

indicated by a letter (a, b, c) after the date. References should not be numbered or given in footnotes, but should be listed at the end in alphabetical order of authors' names, as follows: Author's name and initials, year of publication (in parentheses), title of article, title of periodical (in italics, abbreviated as in *World Medical Periodicals*, 3rd ed., 1961 B.M.A.), volume number (bold type, Arabic), first page number (ordinary type, Arabic), thus:

Rose, G. (1968). Variability of angina. *Brit. J. prev. soc. Med.*, 22, 12.

For books the author's name and initials, year (in parentheses), full title, edition and page number, publisher, and place of publication should be given.

#### PROOFS.

Contributors will receive one proof, and should read it carefully for printers' errors, and check the tables, figures, legends, and any numerical, mathematical, or other scientific expressions. Alterations to the original text should be kept to a minimum.

#### REPRINTS.

Fifty reprints will be supplied free of charge. A limited number of additional reprints may be ordered from the Publishing Manager when the proofs are returned.
