Environmental factors have an important bearing on disease susceptibility, and in this volume scientists and clinicians discuss the association between various environmental and genetic influences.

Immunological incompetence can result in clinical conditions as disparate as skin rash, atherosclerosis and acute depression, and an appraisal is made here of current knowledge of this topical area, with particular emphasis on oral antigens which may result in food intolerance and allergy. The perinatal period is particularly worthy of study, since it constitutes a time when many environmental factors begin to determine the future health and disease susceptibility of the individual.

This book is a unique collection of new findings and eclectic reviews on the most topical aspects of environmental medicine.

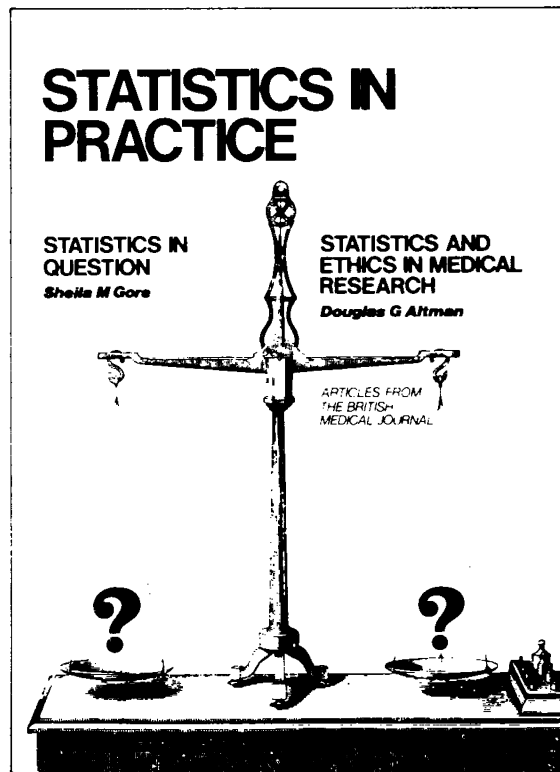

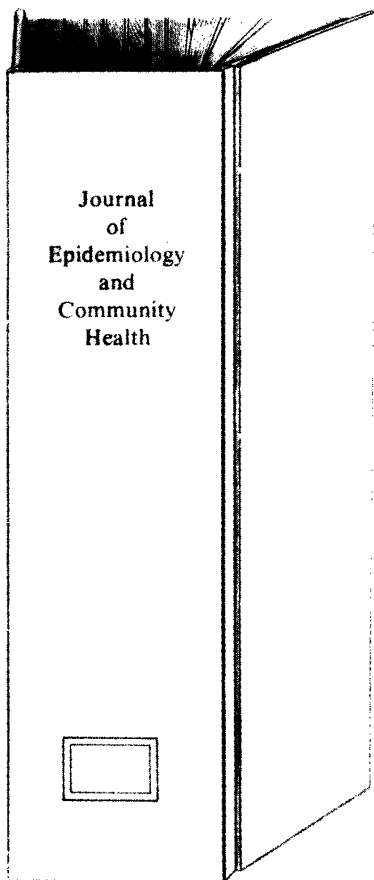
