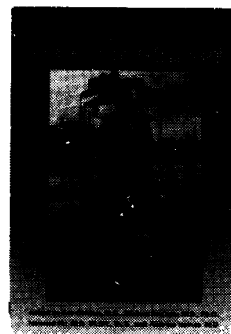

The course, now in its seventh year, is intended for epidemiologists, public health practitioners and clinicians with an interest in epidemiology. It aims to foster through educational activities, the development of epidemiology as a fundamental instrument for health promotion in Europe.
