The course, taught by lecturers from European universities and research institutes, is co-sponsored by the International Agency for Research on Cancer, the Regional Office for Europe of the World Health Organization, The European Union, the International Epidemiological Association, and the Regional Government of Tuscany, Italy. The residential course centre is situated in the hills above Florence.

The director of the course is Rodolfo Saracci, National Research Council, Pisa, Italy. Guest Lecturers will be Professor Paul Kleihues and Sir Richard Doll.

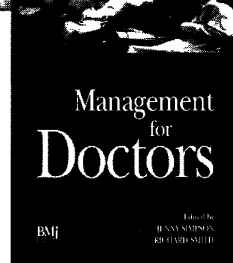
